Everyone has something to offer, and understanding that will help us learn from each other's strengths and weaknesses.

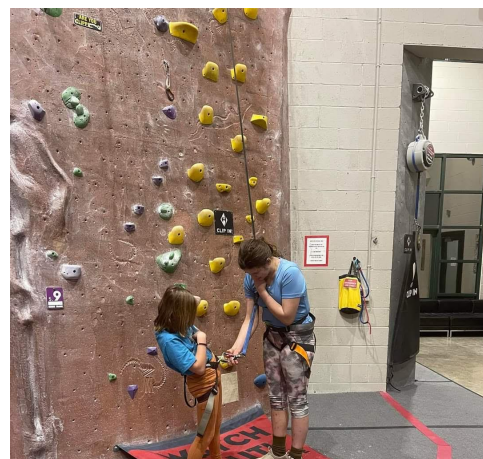
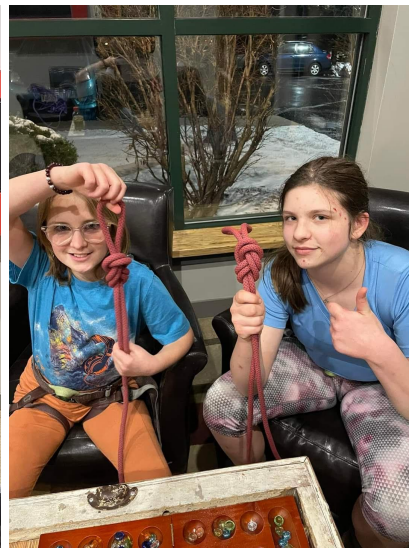
With that being said...we shouldn't forget to practice respect toward our adult leaders, parents, and guardians.
