Have at least two merit badges you're working on at a time, one of which should be an Eagle required one.





Troop 49's Scoutmaster Michael Neimon Unsung Hero

Neimon takes pride in helping hold court system together

Michael Neimon sees the court system as the glue that holds society together.

Many of his colleagues no doubt think the court system itself would have a few more loose ends were it not for the work of the District 3 court administrator. Broadly speaking, Neimon's main

responsibility is to provide administrative support to the chief judge for the Third District, Jennifer Dorow, as well as for circuit-court judges and staff within the district. In practice, the job has him doing everything from helping courts manage their caseloads to overseeing security and construction projects at courthouses.

Neimon may spend a lot of time working with circuit courts in the Third District, which encompasses Jefferson, Ozaukee, Washington and Waukesha counties. But he is technically an employee of the state Supreme Court.

As such, part of his time is spent making sure lower courts are following procedures and rules set by the high court. Neimon said he seldom if ever finds himself having to push someone to come into compliance.

"I mostly try to be a colleague and provide technical and professional expertise in areas that they might not have," he said. "Luckily for me, I have the best clerks of court in the state of Wisconsin. So they make my job a whole lot easier."

In nominating Neimon for an Unsung Hero award, Waukesha County Judge Michael Bohren noted that Neimon sits on the state court's Planning and Policy Advisory Committee's court security subcommittee. Outside of work
