I have been a part of the troop for many years now and have built many great friendships along the way. I will work with my ASPLs and other leadership to make sure the troop is organized and prepared for our meetings and activities. Troop 49 and Lapham Peak Conservation Efforts

Thinking beyond yourself does not mean just helping others. As scouts we have a responsibility to take care of the environment. Each one of us can make a big difference, a positive impact on society and the environment. An area that I have been committed to helping is the conservation efforts at Lapham Peak State Park. Last year Mrs. Neimon and I have become members of "the Friends of Lapham Peak", a conservation group that works in the Park on a variety of projects but for us it has been removing invasive species. Since February of 2020 we have organized and accomplished the following:

- 585 work hours logged
- · 180 volunteers
- · 211 Piles burned
- · Over 329 piles total burned if you count adding onto a burning stack.

We have cleared large areas revealing a beautiful natural landscape and a pond. More importantly a mature forest that was dying now has a chance at regrowth. The users of the park are grateful.

Troop 49 has been a part of that effort. Many scouts have received conservation hours working with us. On behalf of Mrs. Neimon and the Friends of Lapham I want to thank you for that help.

We work mostly on a weekend for 3 hours or so and sometimes a weeknight. I have and will continue to let Troop 49 know of workdays but if any scouts or adults want to organize a work party I will accommodate.

I want to close with this. You all have the power to make a difference. Think about what you do on a weekend. Does what you do make a difference to society or nature? It can, with just a little hard work, I will guarantee whatever it is, you will proud, satisfied and better for it. Come join us on a more regular basis and make a positive difference.
